**Governor Phillip Walk – 10.00am 24 April 2019 - Brian Powyer**

Join *Governor Arthur Phillip* as he retraces his footsteps along the banks of the Parramatta River 231 years ago. Walk past some of the most significant buildings and heritage sites from colonial NSW—Old Government House and Domain, the Parramatta Female Factory, the Government Farm Parramatta site, Lennox Bridge, Old Kings School and many more. Enjoy the unique serenity of Governor Phillip's 1788 camp site at the walk's end.

**Pubs of Parramatta Walk – 10.00am 1 May 2019 - Gary Cater**

Wander through the Parramatta CBD discovering the locations and stories behind 12 of the earliest hotels in NSW. Learn where the first beer was sold in Parramatta, which pot house was visited by Charles Darwin, how St John's Church is connected to the Strong Man Inn, what a 'Mulum in Parvo' might be, and why the death of Lady Mary Fitzroy caused havoc at the Tattersall's Pub – and much more.

**The History of Parramatta Churches -12.30pm 2 May 2019 - Ken Smith**

Church services in Parramatta in the early days of the colony were held under the shade of spreading trees or in sheds. Eventually churches were built by the various denominations for their services. Today many of these structures remain as features of our growing city. The talk covers the establishment of these churches.

**The Foundations of Parramatta Walk 10.00am -12 noon 9 May 2019 - Brian Powyer**

Join us for an easy walk around the historic core of Parramatta. Discover Aboriginal scar trees, Governor Phillips redoubt (fort), the foundations of the original Government Farm, the archaeological remains of Governor Macquarie's first hospital, the oldest building in the CBD, the archaeological remains of convict huts and the Wheatsheath Hotel, the oldest stone bridge in Australia and the foundations of the Old Government House

### **Thomas Hobbes Scott Talk – 12. 30pm 16 May 2019 Brian Powyer**

A one-time resident of Hambledon Cottage Thomas Hobbes Scott is an important but not often mentioned figure in Australian colonial history. Hear about his early life, his friendship John Macarthur, his role in preparing the the Bigge Report, his appointment as the Anglican Archdeacon of NSW, his alignment with the Exclusives in the first Legislative Council and his role in establishing the Anglican Church in Western Australia.

### **Emancipists and Exclusives 7.30pm 17 May 2019 Members of PDHS**

Meet Mrs Macarthur, Samuel Marsden, Francis Greenway, Mrs Macquarie, Mary the Maid, James Macarthur and after mingle with other guests to discuss the merits of the views expressed.
